### 49 <u>CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGES FOR THE LICENSING AND GENERAL PURPOSES</u> <u>COMMITTEES</u>

The Committee considered the report presented by the Principal Legal Officer which provided Members with details of the proposed changes to the remit of both the General Purposes and Licensing Committees and also sought their consideration as to merging the two committees into one single committee.

The report provided a summary of the remits of the two committees and noted that the Council's Audit & Governance Committee were undertaking a review of the Council's Constitution, which included a review of the General Purposes and Licensing Committees. It was further reported that an informal working group met in October 2024 to undertake a desktop review of the current committee terms of reference. The proposed changes resulting from that were a clarification the terms of reference and remove functions that were no longer relevant. The suggestion of merging the two committees was also discussed with the opinion being reached that a single committee was preferable.

In considering the report, Members agreed that the proposal to merge the two committees be supported.

#### AGREED (unanimously) that:

- a) the contents of the report be noted; and
- b) the proposal to merge the General Purposes and Licensing Committees into a single committee be supported.

#### 50 LOCAL GOVERNMENT OMBUDSMAN DECISION OUTCOME REPORT

The Committee considered the report presented by the Business Manager – Public Protection which provided Members with details of the outcome of an investigation where the Ombudsman found fault with the Council.

The report set out the background to the Ombudsman's findings, which had been as a result of a complaint lodged by a resident in relation to the time it had taken the Council to act in respect of a statutory noise nuisance. The actions taken in response to the nuisance were documented in the Local Government & Social Care Ombudsman final decision statement which was attached as Appendix 1 to the report which had also been presented to the Audit & Governance Committee in December 2024. Paragraph 4.0 of the report advised that when a complaint was upheld, it was important that lessons were learnt, details of which were reported in paragraph 4.2 of the report.

In considering the report, Members raised the issue of receiving complaints direct from residents, querying whether they would also receive information from licensing enforcement as to what investigations and/or enforcement actions were currently being undertaken. The Business Manager advised that should Members receive a complaint directly from a resident, they should refer this to the Licensing Team for action.

Reason for Recommendations	To ensure legal compliance alongside the provision of relevant and necessary information.				

#### 1.0 Background

- 1.1 At 20 May 2025 Full Council, a report was taken regarding the Review of the Council's Constitution. From that report the following recommendations were approved at Full Council:
  - adopts the terms of reference for a new Licensing Committee as set out in Appendix G of the report, to be implemented with effect from 15 July 2025;
  - confirms for the Licensing Committee Terms of Reference in the Constitution to be updated accordingly once the Committee has approved any revisions to its Scheme of Delegation;
- 1.2 Following confirmation that the two committees were to be merged as agreed by Full Council, work has been undertaken on the Scheme of Delegation to ensure that references to the two committees have been removed and that all references now solely relate to the Licensing Committee. This is provided in **Appendix A** for consideration.

#### 2.0 Proposal/Options Considered

- 2.1 As required by the Council's constitution, the Scheme of Delegation must ensure clarity on what decisions will be made by officers and which decisions will be made at committees. As the two previous committees are to be merged together, without any other fundamental changes, the Scheme of Delegation has been updated to reflect the change.
- 2.2 The Scheme of Delegation is provided in Appendix A and solely reflects the merging of the committees and makes no other suggested changes. Officers will still have delegated powers to approve licences as they currently do and Members will still be involved in all licensing reviews and panels and to determine applications where it currently requires a panel decision to be made.

# HEARING TO CONSIDER AN APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A PREMISES LICENCE

The Chair informed the hearing that the Principal Legal Officer had provided legal advice before the hearing, the Chair then introduced everyone in the room.

#### **Presentation by the Environmental Health and Licensing Manager**

The application to grant the premises licence was submitted by Reddington Pub Company Ltd. on 17 February 2025. In summary the application seeks to apply for Live Music, Recorded Music and Sale of Alcohol 11:00 – 02:00 Monday to Sunday, Late Night Refreshment 23:00 – 02:00 Monday to Sunday, Opening Hours 11:00 – 02:30 Monday to Sunday with an extension of 1 hour on all timings on Bank Holidays.

A summary of the application is attached as **Appendix A** of the report, the application and plan of the premises are attached as **Appendix B** and a map

showing the site in context of its surroundings is shown as **Appendix C** to this report.

There have been 2 representations from other persons which have been deemed relevant. The representations are attached as **Appendices D and E** of this report. No agreement has been reached between the applicant and the objectors, there has been no response from the objectors to mediation attempts.

An agreement to amend the operating schedule was reached between the applicant and Nottinghamshire Police, the agreement is attached at **Appendix F** of this report.

An agreement to amend the operating schedule was reached between the applicant and Environmental Health, the agreement is attached at **Appendix G** of this report.

#### Questions

George Domleo (Flint Bishop Solicitors) advised that his client had refurbished the property with a view to opening in May which will be asset to the area with the site having been derelict for some time. His client an experienced operator, working with the local community, noting it will be a family friendly venue.

Councillor Hall referred to public nuisance with reference to a winding down policy, with the response within 30 minutes can close and disperse.

George Domleo advised that an age verification policy was in place.

Councillor Darby asked when children would be expected to leave the premises, George Domleo's response was that the cut off point would 10.30pm with flexibility if attending a private function.

#### Summing Up

The Sub- Committee was arranged as a result of 2 remaining representations received form the same household. The applicant acquired the Anchor a couple of years ago. Prior to that, the premises operated as a pub and restaurant. The panel were advised that the Applicant planned to spend in the region of £1m on refurbishment works with an opening date in May. The Anchor will be family friendly, employing some 30 members of staff. A new license was being applied for as the original licence had lapsed.

The applicant also owns the Old Vole and The Reindeer and is therefore an experienced pub operator. The application was presented as sensible and considered, taking appropriate steps to minimise the impact on the local community who would be the target customers.

It was accepted that there is always some anxiety when new applications are made to local authorities and therefore a residents meeting was held during the consultation period whereby 50 or so people form the community attended. One of the representations was withdrawn following the meeting and negotiations with the police and Environmental Health.

With regards to the remaining representations from the same household, there had been an attempt by the local authority and the applicant to engage and mediate but there is a noted lack of response and/or engagement from the representors. Further, the meeting was delayed to ensure the representors had time to attend (there had been a recent change of venue). There was no attendance from the remaining representors.

Within that representation, the applicant noted that there was reference to Tom Browns but the applicant had only just come into ownership of Tom Browns and therefore the panel were invited to disregard that part and invited the panel to conclude that the other concerns were speculative.

A number of questions were asked by the panel and the legal advisors in respect of children being restricted access, SIA staff, the bank holiday opening/operating hours, winding down policy, late night refreshment and the operation of the other venues.

#### **Decision**

The Licensing Subcommittee granted the licence as applied for but as amended and varied with the terms and conditions agreed between Nottinghamshire Police and Newark and Sherwood District Council's Environmental Health Team as set out in the report at pages 7-9.

It is to be noted that the original application for non-standard hours on bank holidays was withdrawn by the applicant.

#### 1.0 Background

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 introduced a light touch system for ad hoc, permitted temporary activities. A Temporary Event Notice (TEN) is given by an individual and authorises the premises user to conduct one or more licensable activities at premises.
- 1.2 There are two types of TEN which are:
  - A standard TEN, to be given no later than 10 working days before the event to which it relates; and
  - A late TEN, can be given 9 and not later than 5 working days before the event. Late
    TENs are intended to be used by premise user who is required for reasons outside
    their control to for example, change the venue at short notice.
- 1.3 Only the Police and Environmental Health can make representation against the TEN. Once the Police and Environmental Health receive a TEN, they have 3 working days to make any objections to it on the grounds of any of the four licensing objectives:
  - 1. Prevention of crime and disorder
  - 2. Prevention of public nuisance
  - 3. Public safety; and the
  - 4. Protection of children from harm.

If no objections are received the event will go ahead as planned. If an objection is received for a standard TEN the Council will have to organise a hearing to consider the objection and may impose conditions or decide that the event cannot go ahead. If an objection is received against a late TEN, no hearing is held and the application is refused.
