Report Summary		
Report Title	Application for Grant of a Premises Licence – Fishing Lodge, Maythorne	
Purpose of Report	For Members to consider an application to grant the premises licence for Fishing Lodge, Maythorne.	
Recommendations	That Members consider the grant application, and the representations made for Fishing Lodge, Maythorne and take the steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps available on determination of an application are: • To refuse to grant the licence • To grant the licence with additional conditions • To grant the licence without additional conditions • To grant the licence but restrict the licensable activities • To grant the licence with restricted times	

1.0 Background

- 1.1 The application to grant the premises licence was submitted by Sarah Elliott on 31 July 2025. In summary the application seeks to apply for Live Music (Indoors/Outdoors), Recorded Music (Indoors/Outdoors) and Sale of alcohol (On and Off) with no seasonal variations or non-standard timings.
- 1.2 A summary of the application is attached as **Appendix A** of the report.

The Application Premises

1.3 The application and plan of the premises are attached as **Appendix B** and a map showing the site in context of its surroundings is shown as **Appendix C** to this report.

2.0 Proposal/Options Considered





To whom it may concern:

I have lived in Maythorne for over forty years and have seen many changes in that time, some for good but sadly many for bad. The attraction of the hamlet to those that live down here is the quietness and closeness to nature and over time this is being eroded and I believe that granting the above application will further erode what Maythorne is to so many.

The application as set out would I believe lead to a public nuisance to residents at a time when many return home after a days work to relax in their home and garden. Outdoor music would carry to the properties and would be particularly annoying on warm summer evenings when more time is spent outside.

There must also be concerns for public safety with regard to vehicles travelling up and down a very narrow road, with at times poor visibility, and then exiting onto a busy A road, (50mph) from a blind corner. Residents are use to it, visitors aren't.

Alcohol brings it's own problems, however served with a meal is acceptable.

To whom it may concern

May I begin by saying my major concerns are the noise level of any outside recorded or live music and traffic/access. Maythorne is a quiet hamlet of Grade II listed buildings, built in 1785, which is surrounded by open countryside and the River Greet. There is an abundance of wildlife including bats to the rear of the cottages (a few hundred yards from the venue), owls behind the Mill, otters in the river, horses and the nearby Southwell Trail.

The lakeside premises were formerly used as a tearoom and were very much in keeping with the ethos of Maythorne. It only opened during the daytime four days a week from 9 a.m. to 3–4 pm (weather dependant).

This new proposal seeks to allow the premises to be open for 90 hours per week 52 weeks a year and introduce evening opening hours and live music events until 11pm. I understand the live events are intended to be 'occasional', but can I say one person's occasional does not necessarily align with another's. The application is vague, is it once a week, once a month or as and when?

The hamlet is approached by a single track lane and at times on a busy summer weekend, when All Mine Cakes was open, it could be a challenge to get out of and into our homes as not everyone takes care and respects others.

When the car park was full customers parked in the lane, which at times became very congested and access of emergency vehicles would have been pretty much impossible – we would expect this problem to be ongoing/increasing if this proposal proceeds. At the end of the lane there is The Old Silk Mill which overlooks the hamlet's car park – this is not adopted by the Council and is a private car park which we are responsible for the upkeep of. Some people historically used our car park to turn their vehicles or would drive into our car park with the impression it would give them access to Corkhill Lane or Kirklington Road. We did ask All Mine Cakes to indicate there was no right turn out of the car park and a notice was erected but it made little difference. This was annoying, but the volume of traffic and the late-night

departures would be totally unacceptable and would disturb people in the cottages, where the road is very narrow, and those in the Mill.

Obviously, these longer hours are going to need to be supported by numerous deliveries (both food and drink), trades people, staff, waste collectors etc as well as the massive increase in customer traffic – which will on some days be for up to 14 hours. Live music performers will also, I would imagine, come with quite a lot of kit.

I am concerned about the granting of an alcohol licence. I accept having a glass of wine etc with food would be fine, but I'm majorly concerned that if this isn't a restriction the venue will, especially when there is live music, just be selling alcohol in a bar type way. This could potentially lead to additional noise, antisocial behaviour, litter, potential property damage, and the erosion of the sense of safety and cohesion that is central to our community.

For these reasons, I respectfully request that all the applications be refused.

This isn't a case of NIMBY, I appreciate business, I ran my own for over 20 years but feel this is just the wrong place for this sort of commercial enterprise. The single track unlit lane access is totally unsuitable for the proposed level of traffic. Visitors, dog walkers, runners, families, walking groups, holiday makers etc all visit the hamlet to take the circular walk to/from Southwell. With dogs and children in tow, all have to walk on the road as there are no pavements and rarely space for two cars to pass each other. The proposal would fundamentally change the character of Maythorne and cause unacceptable disturbance to residents and visitors.

As a community we strongly believe that such an enterprise belongs in a larger, more robustly serviced environment, not in a hamlet like Maythorne. The intrusion of amplified music into the late evening hours is wholly unsuited to such a small rural settlement.



Dear Sir/Madam,

We wish to make a formal objection to the application for licence(s) for The Fishing Lodge, Maythorne.

Maythorne is a unique hamlet, part of the Southwell Conservation Area, consisting of several Grade 2 listed buildings, two fishing lakes and a quiet campsite.

There are several aspects to the application that would be extremely detrimental to the tranquility of the hamlet of Maythorne, the well-being of its residents and visitors as well as having an adverse effect to surrounding wildlife.

The application requests an alcohol licence, extension of the opening hours from 9am to 11pm most days of the week, and to play live music outside of the building next to the lake (and to change the name of the venue to The Fishing Lodge).

When the venue was All Mine Cakes By The Lake the owners respectfully limited the venue's opening hours from approximately 10am - 3-4pm four/five days a week. They also refrained from playing music outside. These opening hours and management of the tearooms had little impact on the tranquility of the hamlet, its residents and the visitors to both the adjacent campsite and those fishing in the lake.

APPENDIX G

The new application, we feel, with late opening hours, external music and sale of alcohol (and all the potential disruptions that may go with that) would be very detrimental to the ambience, conservation/preservation of Maythorne and the well-being of its inhabitants.

Late night opening and external music would also impact on the wildlife in the surrounding area which includes barn owls, bats, black otters (all being endangered species protected by the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017) deer, kingfishers etc. etc.

As Maythorne sits within Southwell Conservation Area the residents of both the cottages and the Mill Apartments are concerned that, should such an application be successful, there would be an erosion of the Conservation Area as well as having an adverse impact on life in the hamlet.

In principle, we have no personal objections to ambient/background music being played inside the premises, nor do we object to the change of name. Our objection is to the extended opening hours, external music, and the sale of alcohol.

I therefore request that the application be refused.

I am writing concerning the application by Ms Sarah Elliott for The Fishing Lodge (formerly All Mine Cakes), Maythorne, NG25 ORS. You can see that I live close by – in fact in the same postcode.

In its previous use as a tea-room, the building was regarded as an asset to the village.

However, there are some aspects to Ms Elliott's application which concern me.

1. ALCOHOL

I have no objection to alcohol being served with a meal at the premises. I would be concerned if the premises were to be allowed to operate as a bar – especially as Ms Elliott has ticked 'provision of late night refreshment' on the application. This would potentially present problems under the heading of 'public nuisance'.

Everyone living at Maythorne has chosen to live here because of the quiet rural atmosphere, and, while a licensed restaurant would generally not be a problem, a bar, particularly if functioning late in the evening, would be.

2. MUSIC

If anything - more concerning.

I have no objection to quiet background music, whether recorded or live, being played inside the premises.

However, it is suggested on the application that music be played also in the outside seating area. I would suggest that this would come under the heading of public nuisance, as it would disturb the residents, the many local walkers, the wildlife and the fishermen. Music that can be heard outside would of course mitigate again the activity of fishing, as it might worry the fish.

In particular, the application mentions 'occasional live music sets'. My strongest objection is to this. Live Music tends to be loud and amplified, and would certainly not be in keeping with the ambience of Maythorne. Live music also tends to attract a younger and perhaps rowdier clientele. Even more of a public nuisance.

I will welcome an eatery (as Ms Elliott describes it on her application) opening in Maythorne.

If provision of alcohol is with meals only, and if music is confined to background music indoors, then I perceive no problem.

I hope you will able to ensure these restrictions when reviewing the licence.

As a resident of Maythorne I am extremely concerned about the amount of traffic which will undoubtedly increase significantly should a licence be granted from 9am until 11pm, 7 days a week. The lane leading to the hamlet is single track and UNLIT. There are NO footpaths allowing the safe walking of pedestrians with their children and dogs. Parking near our houses in the past when All Mine Cakes was a tea shop was impossible at times which will only become more problematic should the eatery be granted an alcohol licence until late in the evening.

At the present time Maythorne is one of the few areas locally which has no light pollution. I am concerned that a late night eatery will have an adverse effect on the light and coupled with increased nighttime noise could significantly disturb local wildlife (deer, bats, badgers, horses and hedgehogs)

The licensed eatery will undoubtedly increase footfall in the area which could increase low level crime as customers leave under an influence of alcohol. Noise carries significantly in the hamlet, this will increase causing upset to the residents.

I hope you will seriously consider my grounds for opposition, these coming from an ex publican who moved here for the tranquility of the area.

Objection to Licence Application for the Fishing Lodge (previously All Mine Cakes by the Lake, Maythorne, Southwell)

I wish to object to the alcohol licence application by Sarah ELLIOTT in respect of the building which used to be a café called All Mine Cakes by the Lake (AMC), Fishing lodge, Maythorne, Southwell, Nottinghamshire, NG25 0RS.

I also object to any licence applied for in respect of live music at those premises.

I have interest in this application that is greater than the general public, as I strongly believe the current proposals will negatively affect the lives of the Maythorne residents including myself.

The prevention of public nuisance:

The former café business was closed by about 1600hrs on operating days.

The new proposal is suggesting 23.00 as a closing time every single day.

In my opinion, there will be unacceptable noise as people leave the 'restaurant' / 'or any music events' with car doors, vehicle noise as they drive away, or as people decide to walk home (either along the trail or behind the mill). The proposed 23.00 hours closing could lead to public intoxication, associated rowdiness and in general a deterioration of community quality of life due to a later opening times.

People in drink do not tend to be quiet or respectful of people who live nearby. If they choose to walk home behind the mill this will be right in front of resident houses / flats. The associated noise would not be acceptable. It does not matter what signs are put up or what is told to customers, proprietors have no control over people leaving their premises.

Any application to play music outside is not acceptable, the site is too close in proximity to the residences of Maythorne. We can hear events at Norwood which is a fair distance away, I do not want evenings and sleep ruined listening to 'live music' weddings or any other 'events' that I have not chosen to see or listen to and that are essentially a few hundred yards away and / or people leaving late at night.

The road away from the 'site' and out of Maythorne is essentially single lane, with a 60mph speed limit, has no streetlights at all, there will be an increased risk of not seeing hazards in the road until it's too late. Residents are familiar with the roads and that it is narrow to pass.

I am concerned that this proposal would negatively change the character of this beautiful hamlet, rather than enhancing it.

I would just like to add;

The previous business was a café open at the earliest 09.30 and closed at the latest by 4pm. So any patrons of the café were usually away by 5pm with no impact to me (my household) or the residents of Maythorne. It closed Mondays / Tuesdays. This meant the hamlet had 2 days of peace & quiet during the day when the café was closed.

(AMC café **did** have a liquor licence but only briefly and this did not enable them to extend **beyond** those times, it also remained a café and never opened for special events – one off or otherwise).

The building in question is displaying a notice explaining they have requested a proposed use / variation to be a restaurant – operating **7 days per week**, supply alcohol **0900-2300**.

The proposal on the public portal notice is very different, i.e.

The proposed use/variation is:

Live Music – Indoors/Outdoors Monday to Thursday 12:00 – 22:00 Friday and Saturday 12:00 – 23:00 Sunday 12:00 – 18:00

Recorded Music – Indoors/Outdoors Monday to Wednesday 09:00 – 22:00 Thursday to Saturday 09:00 – 23:00 Sunday 09:00 – 18:00

Supply of Alcohol – **On and Off** the Premises Monday to Saturday 09:00 – 23:00 Sunday 09:00 – 21:00.

Opening Hours Monday to Saturday 09:00 - 23:00 Sunday 09:00 - 21:00

No mention of live music on the advert. The café never played music to my knowledge, certainly not outside so no real impact to the residents.

I deliberately chose to live in Maythorne because it is a beautiful sleepy hamlet, that doesn't have shops, pubs, etc.

Maythorne has amazing wildlife, in and around the lake, there are also bats that can be seen early evenings and this could have an impact on them. I appreciate this is not covered by one of the 4 'objections' but feel it is relevant.

I would be prepared to present my objections at any Hearing.

I am not against a business in Maythorne, the café fitted in well for the most part, however the car park was not always sufficient and often there was an overflow of cars parked on the lane which caused residents issues. However, due to the shorter business hours of the café this was usually resolved by late afternoon. The business hours being proposed on this application could well mean those issues will not only resurface but could extend late into every evening.

I am very concerned that there will be no control once permission is granted for alcohol and music, by giving a business 'a Yes' to occasional events, who decides what is occasional? If they are successful then occasional becomes every weekend or more.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to formally object to the above licensing application on the grounds of all four of the licensing objectives under the Licensing Act 2003:

1. Public Safety

The hamlet is accessed solely by a single narrow lane. This lane is unlit, has blind bends, and is not designed to accommodate increased traffic volumes, particularly at night. According to The Department for Transport, accident risk is significantly higher in unlit rural lanes with restricted visibility. In this situation there will be an increase of taxis coming and going from the premises, people arriving and leaving in their cars and also people who will be walking home along the lane where there is no pedestrian walk ways. Many people already park on this lane to go walking and as the carpark of the premises is shared by people who fish around the pond and overflow of parked cars on the lane would increase accident risks. Should an incident occur on this lane, the hamlet would be completely cut off, preventing access for residents, service vehicles, and potentially emergency responders.

2. Prevention of Public Nuisance

The application includes permission for recorded and live music both inside and out. In rural areas, low background noise levels mean amplified music carries a considerable distance. The World Health Organisation's guidelines on community noise note that exposure to elevated noise levels at night can have a harmful effect on health and wellbeing. In addition to residents, the local wildlife such as owls and bats will be disturbed by the disruption to their natural habitat. In addition to this here are stables close by and horses grazing day and night only metres away.

3. Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The sale of alcohol until raises the risk of antisocial behaviour and disturbance, particularly when visitors leave the premises late at night. National statistics show that alcohol-related disorder is most prevalent in the evening and night time. The isolated location of the hamlet and the absence of any regular policing presence heighten these concerns.

4. Protection of Children from Harm

The single lane is used daily by families and children walking or cycling and on occasions pony riding. An increase in traffic, combined with alcohol consumption, would raise the risk of accidents, as mentioned above, narrow unlit rural roads with no pedestrian walk ways already pose an elevated danger to vulnerable road users.

For the reasons set out above, and in the interest of safeguarding the community, I respectfully request that this application be refused. The proposal poses clear risks to public safety, increases the likelihood of public nuisance, and jeopardises both community wellbeing and environmental protection.

Objection to Licence Application for the Fishing Lodge (previously All Mine Cakes by the Lake, Maythorne, Southwell)

My wife Corriane Allen has objected to the above application and I also wish to object to the alcohol licence application by Sarah ELLIOTT in respect of the building which used to be a café called All Mine Cakes by the Lake (AMC), Fishing lodge, Maythorne, Southwell, Nottinghamshire, NG25 ORS.

I also object to any licence applied for in respect of live music at those premises.

I have interest in this application that is greater than the general public, as I strongly believe the current proposals will negatively affect the lives of the Maythorne residents including myself.

The prevention of public nuisance:

The former café business was closed by about 1600hrs on operating days.

The new proposal is suggesting 23.00 as a closing time every single day.

In my opinion, there will be unacceptable noise as people leave the 'restaurant' / 'or any music events' with car doors, vehicle noise as they drive away, or as people decide to walk home (either along the trail or behind the mill). The proposed 23.00 hours closing could lead to public intoxication, associated rowdiness and in general a deterioration of community quality of life due to a later opening times.

People in drink do not tend to be quiet or respectful of people who live nearby. If they choose to walk home behind the mill this will be right in front of resident houses / flats. The associated noise would not be acceptable. It does not matter what signs are put up or what is told to customers, proprietors have no control over people leaving their premises.

Any application to play music outside is not acceptable, the site is too close in proximity to the residences of Maythorne. We can hear events at Norwood which is a fair distance away, I do not want evenings and sleep ruined listening to 'live music' weddings or any other 'events' that I have not chosen to see or listen to and that are essentially a few hundred yards away and / or people leaving late at night.

Public Safety (& Protection of children from harm)

The road away from the 'site' and out of Maythorne is essentially single lane, with a 60mph speed limit, has no streetlights at all, there will be an increased risk of not seeing hazards in the road until it's too late. Residents are familiar with the roads and that it is narrow to pass.

I am concerned that this proposal would negatively change the character of this beautiful hamlet, rather than enhancing it.

I would just like to add;

The previous business was a café open at the earliest 09.30 and closed at the latest by 4pm. So any patrons of the café were usually away by 5pm with no impact to me (my household) or the residents of Maythorne. It closed Mondays / Tuesdays. This meant the hamlet had 2 days of peace & quiet during the day when the café was closed.

(AMC café **did** have a liquor licence but only briefly and this did not enable them to extend **beyond** those times, it also remained a café and never opened for special events – one off or otherwise).

The building in question is displaying a notice explaining they have requested a proposed use / variation to be a restaurant – operating **7 days per week**, supply alcohol **0900-2300**.

The proposal on the public portal notice is very different, i.e.

The proposed use/variation is:

Live Music – Indoors/Outdoors Monday to Thursday 12:00 – 22:00 Friday and Saturday 12:00 – 23:00 Sunday 12:00 – 18:00

Recorded Music – Indoors/Outdoors Monday to Wednesday 09:00 – 22:00 Thursday to Saturday 09:00 – 23:00 Sunday 09:00 – 18:00

Supply of Alcohol – **On and Off** the Premises Monday to Saturday 09:00 – 23:00 Sunday 09:00 – 21:00.

Opening Hours Monday to Saturday 09:00 – 23:00 Sunday 09:00 – 21:00

No mention of live music on the advert. The café never played music to my knowledge, certainly not outside so no real impact to the residents.

I deliberately chose to live in Maythorne because it is a beautiful sleepy hamlet, that doesn't have shops, pubs, etc.

Maythorne has amazing wildlife, in and around the lake, there are also bats that can be seen early evenings and this could have an impact on them. I appreciate this is not covered by one of the 4 'objections' but feel it is relevant.

I would be prepared to present my objections at any Hearing.

I am not against a business in Maythorne, the café fitted in well for the most part, however the car park was not always sufficient and often there was an overflow of cars parked on the lane which caused residents issues. However, due to the shorter business hours of the café this was usually resolved by late afternoon. The business hours being proposed on this application could well mean those issues will not only resurface but could extend late into every evening.

I am very concerned that there will be no control once permission is granted for alcohol and music, by giving a business 'a Yes' to occasional events, who decides what is occasional? If they are successful then occasional becomes every weekend or more.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to formally object to the application for a licence to operate a café/bar with extended opening hours and live music at the premises formerly used as a tearoom in Maythorne.

Maythorne is a small, peaceful hamlet comprising grade II listed buildings in an area of great natural beauty. Residents here have chosen to live in this community specifically to enjoy its quiet rural character. The premises in question were previously operated as a tearoom, open only during the daytime (approximately 9 a.m. to 3–4 p.m., four days a week). This modest arrangement was entirely in keeping with the tranquil nature of the hamlet.

The new proposal, however, seeks to introduce evening opening hours until 10 pm weekdays, 11 pm at weekends and some live music events until 11 pm. This could fundamentally change the character of Maythorne and cause unacceptable disturbance to all residents. The intrusion of music into the late evening hours is wholly unsuited to such a small rural settlement.

Furthermore, access to the premises is down a narrow one-track lane, used by many walkers with dogs and children accessing the Southwell trail and the Robin Hood trail. There are no pavements on the lane. Already on Bank Holiday weekends, traffic was at an acceptably high level and parking would run out at the tea rooms causing patrons to park down both sides of the lane, blocking access to the hamlet for emergency vehicles. With extended hours and music events, this problem will only be exacerbated. Another issue is going to be supply trucks for the business – with 90 hours a week open time, supplies will be needed daily. Large delivery trucks in the lane pose considerable danger to walkers who are forced into ditches and hedges to escape them.

Further, I wish to register my strong objection to the granting of an alcohol licence for the premises. The introduction of a licensed café/bar raises legitimate concerns about noise, antisocial behaviour, litter, potential property damage, and the erosion of the sense of safety and cohesion that is central to our community.

In summary, I urge the Council to recognise that this proposal is incompatible with the quiet enjoyment of our homes, and with the rural setting of Maythorne itself. We strongly believe that such an enterprise belongs in a larger, more robustly serviced environment, not in a hamlet such as ours.

For these reasons, I respectfully request that the application be refused.

Dear Licensing Department,

I am writing to formally object to the application for a license to operate a café/bar with extended opening hours and live music at the premises of the former Fishing Lodge, formerly All Mine Cakes by the Lake, in Maythorne, Southwell, Nottinghamshire.

Impact on the material character of neighbourhood.

Maythorne is a quiet hamlet that has remained materially untouched for more than two hundred years. Whilst there have been some small changes that have occurred by means of improvements to quality of life, there have been few that have changed the overall ambience of the area.

Whilst this planning application does not change the look of the main part of the hamlet, it will by its nature remove aspects of both privacy and peace which have been a boon to the resident population. In fact, the majority of the residents came here, for the privacy and the quiet.

The establishment of the new business under it's requested licensing permissions will be an imposition against the reason people came here.

I would like to place particular emphasis of my objection on the extended opening hours, live music and the serving of alcohol. The serving of alcohol by its very nature will lead to antisocial behaviour within our otherwise idyllic community.

The proprietor of All Mine Cakes by the Lake, requested a "brown sign" to the establishment and was pleased to have "put Maythorne on the map", however, the rest of us that live here, do so

because it is outside of town and quiet. We, as residents of this tranquil hamlet, never requested it be put on the map.

2. Disruption to quality of life

Residents of Maythorne agreed to a small tea room, initially. This quickly grew to become a large tea room/restaurant. The changes to our quiet and historic hamlet made by this choice to significantly increase the size of the old fishing lodge were notably negative. During its' limited opening hours of 9-4pm, 4 days per week, parking was insufficient for the users of the fishing lake *and* the café/restaurant during busy periods.

People would park all along the edges of the lane and into entrances to the trail/bridleway. This caused trouble entering and leaving the Hamlet by car and trouble for horse riders wishing to use the bridleway and the lane.

Before the installation of the tea rooms, the hamlet was a quiet place known by few. With the installation of a restaurant with a drinks license and much longer opening hours, issues relating to parking and loss of privacy can only increase.

During the period in which 'All Mine Cakes by the Lake' was originally open, I found that there was an increase of people coming to the down the lane and looking into windows of our houses. However, since the café has closed this has significantly reduced.

This is a quiet neighbourhood, with a strong sense of community and privacy, and this behaviour has significantly affected this.

The material changes to the environmental noise and light pollution levels will significantly and negatively affect the resident's enjoyment of our hamlet. This location is our home, and we came here primarily for a peaceful community led lifestyle.

The change of use of the restaurant can only negatively affect the very thing that drew most of the residents here.

I do not feel that due consideration is being made to the quality of life of all residents.

The very idea that music will be contained within the business footprint is frankly laughable. Sound carries and it carries all the more in places that are otherwise silent.

A music license will remove any hope of quiet summer evenings. Windows will need to remain closed. This seems materially unfair.

3. Impact to local wildlife

Maythorne is such a special place to live, partly due to the fact that it is surrounded by so much nature. We residents are fortunate enough to be greeted by Hares at dawn and dusk, and Owls and bats during the twilight and night hours.

With the arrival of a drinks and live music license we are inevitably going to see an increase in the noise and light pollution within the immediate area.

I am significantly concerned that the increase in both noise and light is going to affect a wide array of animals, such as the population of local hares, badgers, and owls, all of which may be sensitive to environmental change.

I would be heartbroken to see the local fauna having to move away from the place that I love to call home.

4. Parking, congestion issues, and increased footfall.

During the operation of the original 'All Mine Cakes by the Lake', parking and congestion became a significant problem for the neighbourhood.

We found that during opening hours parking would consistently overrun from the lake carpark into the lane itself. This led to the consistent erosion of the lane verges, and would often make the lane much harder to navigate. This was made all the worse by the fact that people who did not live here, did not understand how to correctly use passing points.

The increased levels of customers of the café/restaurant on Maythorne lane led to consistent traffic, which in itself led to congestion on the lane.

Maythorne Lane is a narrow lane that has previously been used by few cars, and farm machinery as this is also a working farm. The lane became, during the active operation of 'All Mine Cakes by the Lake' a well-used thoroughfare. As a result, there were many occasions that I found it hard to get down the lane in my own vehicle.

Where 'All Mine Cakes by the Lake' had short hours of operation, this meant that in the evenings the congestion was significantly reduced. However, the extended opening hours of the new proposal means that this will become an issue all day and into the evening. There will no longer be any respite from this.

In Summary, I would urge the council to recognize that this proposal is incompatible with the quiet enjoyment of our homes and with the rural setting of Maythorne itself. We, as residents, strongly believe that this type of enterprise belongs in a larger, more robustly serviced environment, such as the Southwell Town Centre, not in a tiny hamlet such as Maythorne. There are many places that offer the kind of thing the new proprietor wishes to offer in our market town. There are live music venues, restaurants, bars and clubs to go to beginning less than a mile away. Town bars and pubs are withing walking distance but cause no disruption to the Hamlet.

Nottinghamshire Police have received your premise licence application for the Fishing Lodge. Maythorne. Southwell

-: We are happy to accept your application but would like to suggest the below conditions to be placed on your premise licence. if the licence is granted, it would become legally binding conditions to be adhered to and placed upon such a licence.

It does mention a 'paginated book' on conditions 3. This can be a diary, or a bound reference book with numbered pages.

1. A CCTV system shall be installed and operative in the premises when licensable activities are taking place.

All recordings used in conjunction with CCTV shall:

- 1. be of evidential quality
- 2. shall display accurate time and date stamps all year round to account for day light savings.
- 3. be retained for a period of 31 days.
- 4. Cover the point of sale, (Counter) and entrance and exit.
- 5. The CCTV System should be installed in a location that is safe and accessible.

- 6. Recordings to be made available for inspection to the Police or any other authorised person when requested.
- 7. At least one person trained and authorised to access the CCTV system shall be present during opening hours. They shall be able perform basic operations such as reviewing recordings and download recordings to removable media (USB) if required for Police or other authorised officers.
- 2. All staff engaged or to be engaged in the sale of alcohol on the premises shall receive the following training in age restricted sales -:
- Induction training which must be completed and documented prior to the sale of alcohol by the staff member.
- Refresher/reinforcement training at intervals of no more than 6 months.
- Training records will be retained at the premises for a minimum period of 12 months and available for inspection upon request by a Police Officer and/or authorised person
 - 3. A bound and sequentially paginated incident book or electronic record shall be kept, to record all instances of disorder, damage to property and personal injury at the premises. This book shall be made available for inspection and copying by the Police or any other authorised person upon request and all such books shall be retained at the premises for at least 12 months.
 - 4. A Challenge 25 scheme shall operate at the premises. Any person who appears to be under 25 years of age shall not be allowed to purchase alcohol unless they produce an acceptable form of photo identification. (e.g. passport, driving licence, Military ID or PASS accredited card).
 - 5. Challenge 25 notices shall be displayed in prominent positions throughout the premises.

Please take time to consider these conditions, if you wish to discuss this with me further please contact me using the details below. I am more than happy to go through these conditions with you.

If you agree to the conditions above, please reply to this email trail and add the following - "I accept this email as agreement of proposed conditions and for the operating schedule to be amended, and agree not to have a hearing".

I will then inform the Licensing Authority at Newark & Sherwood District Council of our agreement and that we do not wish to make an objection to the granting of the licence.
