1 DECLARATIONS OF INTERESTS FROM MEMBERS AND OFFICERS

NOTED: that no Member or Officer declared any interest pursuant to any statutory requirement in any matter discussed or voted upon at the meeting.

2 DECLARATION OF ANY INTENTION TO RECORD MEETING

NOTED: that there would be an audio recording of the meeting.

3 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Minute No. 27 – Minutes of the meeting held on 15 March 2017

It was requested that Councillors Mrs S.M. Michael and Mrs A.A. Truswell's apologies be included within the Minutes.

AGREED that subject to the above amendment the Minutes of the meeting held on 15 March 2018 be approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

4 REVIEW OF STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY

The Committee considered the report presented by the Business Manager Environmental Health & Licensing which sought Members' approval for the draft revision of the Council's Licensing Policy and to commence the consultation process.

A copy of the 2019 draft Statement of Licensing Policy was attached as an appendix to the report. A large font had been used to identify where changes were proposed.

The changes to the document reflected the amendments to the Licensing Act 2013 brought in since 2014 and the document had additional information within it that was previously absent. There had been no fundamental changes to any of the policies previously agreed.

A typographical error was found on page 25, 8.1 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, and should read 'Club' Premises Certificates.

A Member commented on the Health & Safety of the bar garden for one of the local Public Houses as the seating area was in close proximity to the river Trent. Three people had already fallen in the river and it was felt that the seating area should be addressed to prevent any further accidents.

The Business Manager Environmental Health & Licensing confirmed the law regarding the licensing around the premises. He confirmed that the Business Unit had undertaken work with that licensed premise to ensure a safer environment.

Members also commented on the spread of the seating areas from the cafés in Newark Market place and felt that this was putting customers at risk from authorised vehicles that were allowed access into the Market Place.

The Chairman confirmed that this issue had been addressed with the Business Manager and an update report would be provided to a future meeting of the Committee.

AGREED (unanimously) that:

- (a) the draft revision of the Council's Licensing Policy be noted and the consultation process be commenced; and
- (b) an update report on the seating arrangements for the cafés within Newark Market Place be submitted to a future meeting of the Committee.

5 LICENSING ACT TRAINING FOR MEMBERS AND OFFICERS

The Committee considered the report presented by the Business Manager Environmental Health & Licensing in relation to Licensing Act training being provided for both Officers and Members by the Nottinghamshire Authorities Licensing Group, scheduled for Wednesday, 4 July 2018 at the Hostess Restaurant in Mansfield.

Members of the Committee were requested to let Officers know if they were able to attend the training.

AGREED (unanimously) that the following Members confirmed their attendance for the forth coming training.

6 COUNTYWIDE BEST BAR NONE SCHEME

The Committee considered the report presented by the Business Manager Environmental Health & Licensing in relation to the final year report on year three of the county wide Best Bar None Scheme.

The report set out the background to the introduction of the scheme and the rewards for the licensees. The report also detailed the scheme to date from year one 2015/16, year two 2016/17 and year three 2017/18. The future of the scheme was also detailed and discussions had been undertaken with potential funders to provide some sustainability for the scheme. Licensing Authorities had been requested to commit their support for the scheme in years four and five. It was reported that there was no direct financial commitment required but some officer time would be required. It was not anticipated that this would have any detrimental impact on the other duties of the Licensing Team.

AGREED (unanimously) that:

- (a) the progress of the Nottinghamshire County Best Bar None Scheme be noted; and
- (b) the scheme in years four and five be supported.

7 MINUTES OF PERSONAL LICENCE HEARING

The Committee noted the Minutes of the Personal Licence Hearing for Mohammad Aamer Hussain, which was held on 1 May 2018.

AGREED (unanimously) that the Minutes be noted.

8 UPDATE ON QUARTERLY PERFORMANCE AND ENFORCEMENT MATTERS

The Committee considered the report presented by the Business Manager Environmental Health & Licensing in relation to the activity and performance of the Licensing Team between 1 January and 31 March 2018 inclusive and to provide Members with details of current ongoing enforcement issues.

Information contained within the report related to the number of applications for the grant or variation of licences received between the above dates and the enforcement activity between 1 October and 31 December 2017 which were listed at 2.3 of the report. It was also noted in order by way of comparison, the number of Temporary Event Notices received for the same period last year was 45.

Members commented on the Ongoing Enforcement Activity reported and requested that more information be provided rather than just verbal advice given, in order for them to be aware of what was happening in the district. The Chairman requested that a report be submitted to a future meeting regarding what Enforcement Activity was being undertaken to keep the Committee informed.

AGREED (unanimously) that:

- (a) the information contained within the report; and
- (b) a report be submitted to a future meeting of the Committee, regarding what Enforcement Activity was being undertaken to keep the Committee informed.

SCHEMELINK FOR PUBWATCH

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To seek approval for the purchase of the Schemelink software for the members of Pubwatch within Newark & Sherwood.

2.0 Background

2.1 Pubwatch is a voluntary organisation set up to promote best practice. Its aim is to achieve a safer drinking environment in all licensed premises throughout the UK.

2.2 In Newark & Sherwood, we have 3 Pubwatch schemes. They are based in Newark, Ollerton and Southwell. Each area meets once a month and discusses issues that affects them and helps the share of information. Newark Pubwatch is well attended with approximately 15 members, Ollerton and Southwell have approximately 11 members each.

2.3 Pubwatch meetings consider issues such as problematic customers, licensing issues, previous incidents and how they were handled and up and coming events that may impact on licensed premises.

2.4 Traditionally, members of Pubwatch have a book that contains the details of the banned members. These are kept on the licensed premise. Updating these books has been an issue faced by all of the schemes within our area due to data protection restrictions and information sharing.

2.5 Schemelink is an app which has been developed as a central point for easier data sharing of data and communication across scheme types for example pubwatch, shopwatch, unifying online services for members, police and councils.

2.6 Features of Schemelink include:

- Group chat
- Incident logs, which once submitted are sent through to all members
- Push notifications
- Notice board, for sharing information for example, photos of counterfeit notes
- Ability to poll about a ban rather than wait until the next meeting
- Banned gallery – which includes individual watermarks for members, so if images were shared inappropriately it would be easy to discover who had shared them.
- Each member can appoint temporary access to others for a period of 24 hours, this would be used for SIA door staff.

2.7 Schemelink is used successfully in Bassetlaw areas of Retford and Worksop.

2.8 Officers have recently had a demonstration of the system and they are of the opinion that it would greatly enhance the working pubwatch across all Newark & Sherwood. As well as strengthening partnership working between the Licensing Authority, the Police and the trade.

3.0 Proposals

3.1 It is proposed that the Council pay for active members of the Pubwatch schemes to have the Schemelink membership for 1 year. An active member being a venue that is represented at Pubwatch meeting at least 9 out of 12 meetings a year.

3.2 If a member fails to be active, the local authority will notify the Schemelink providers who will cancel their membership and issue the local authority with a voucher for the remaining period, which can be used by another organisation.

3.3 The price of the scheme for individuals is £35.99. If bulk bought the price per member would be £31 for 40 plus members and £28 for 50 plus members.

3.4 It is estimated that the purchase of 40 licences would be appropriate to actively support the 3 Pubwatch schemes.

3.5 It is anticipated that at the end of year one the members of Pubwatch will see the benefits from the system and will be willing to fund their own membership going forward.

4.0 Financial Implications

4.1 The total price of providing 40 licences would be £1,240. This cost can be found from the existing licensing budget A10814 45101.

5.0 RECOMMENDATION

That the Committee consider the contents of the report and support the purchase of 40 annual licences for the Schemelink app at a cost of £1,240 for one year only.

Reason for Recommendation

To support Pubwatch and make the workings of Pubwatch more effective and efficient.

LICENSING ACT TRAINING

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To provide feedback to Members on the Licensing Act update training provided on 4 July 2018

2.0 Background

2.1 The Nottinghamshire Authorities Licensing Group hosted a training course at the Hostess Restaurant in Mansfield for Officers and Members across the County. The training was organised for the group by Officers from Newark & Sherwood. The training covered the following areas of licensing legislation:

- County lines and drug trafficking
- Safeguarding and vulnerable people in the night time economy
- Licensing hearings

2.2 This year's training was delivered by a range of speakers from various organisations including the LGA. The session on Licensing Hearing was delivered by local authority staff and looked at best practice across the county.

2.3 These sessions were delivered to help licensing authorities take a strategic approach to the licensing regime and make the best use of the available powers to deliver a balance between promotion and restraint and help implement best practice.

2.4 Not all Members were able to attend and a copy of the notes from the training will be made available to those Members wishing to have them.

2.5 The Nottinghamshire Authorities Licensing Group have met since the training and the feedback given was that most of those present thought the training was well delivered and useful to both experienced Members and Members new to licensing.

2.6 It is intended to provide additional training for Members next year and any suggestions for topics to be covered can be made to licensing staff who will feed this back to the organising group.

3.0 RECOMMENDATION

That Members provide feedback on the licensing training event and make any suggestions for future training.

ADDRESSING CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION AND VULNERABLE ADULTS IN LICENCED PREMISES.

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To update Members on the actions being taken to address issues of safeguarding in licensed premises.

2.0 Background

2.1 Members will no doubt be aware of the increased scrutiny on ensuring that users of the night time economy are safe to do so and that younger people and vulnerable adults are safe from harm.

3.0 Introduction

3.1 The first steps in addressing safeguarding issues falling within the licensing remit of Newark & Sherwood was taken with the introduction of the requirement for all licensed drivers to undertake safeguarding training.

3.2 Recently the focus has moved towards premises licenced under the Licensing Act 2003 and consideration of how to engage the staff working in this wide range of premises.

2.5 A county group has been established to look at this issue and the following work plan has been agreed.

- Develop and distribute range of advisory leaflets for:
 - Licensed Premises
 - Late Night Takeaways
 - Accommodation sector
- Deliver Safeguarding training to staff working in alcohol licenced premises
- Carry out 'test purchasing' at accommodation providers
- Deliver Safeguarding training to alcohol licenced premises door staff
- Deliver Safeguarding training to accommodation providers that fail test purchasing

3.0 Progress to Date

3.1 Leaflets covering a range of premises have been designed. All the licensing authorities across the county are using the same design so that there is a consistency of approach. These are planned to be distributed through August and September.

3.2 A number of sessions delivering safeguarding training to staff employed in licensed premises have been delivered. These have been well received and representatives from some of the major venues in Newark have attended.

3.3 Positive engagement with the door staff companies has taken place and a date for a training session for this sector has been confirmed.

4.0 **RECOMMENDATION**

That Members note the actions being taken to address safeguarding in the night time economy.

A COMMUNITY ALCOHOL PARTNERSHIP FOR OLLERTON

1.0 Purpose of Report

- 1.1 To feedback to Members on the establishment of a Community Alcohol Partnership (CAP) in Ollerton and to seek representation on the Project Group.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 Community Alcohol Partnerships is a Community Interest Company whose aim is to prevent underage and business, and provision of appropriate drinking and the resulting harm to communities. A combination of enforcement, education, engagement of the community and businesses, and provision of appropriate diversionary activity for young people is the hallmark of the CAP model.

- 2.2 Community Alcohol Partnerships bring together local retailers & licensees, trading standards, police, health services, education providers and other local stakeholders to tackle the problem of underage drinking and associated anti-social behaviour

- 2.3 The CAP model is unique in that it recognises that retailers and licensees are part of the solution and has been shown to be more effective than traditional enforcement methods alone. Each CAP scheme operates in a clearly delineated and usually compact local community and draws on local partners to develop and implement delivery at grassroots level

- 2.4 The core activity of Community Alcohol Partnerships includes:

Education

Each CAP includes some educational aspects. These might include partnering with local schools to deliver age appropriate alcohol education, teacher training support and parental advice and guidance.

Enforcement

CAPs focus on both the supply and the demand side of underage drinking and treat retailers & licensees as part of the solution and not part of the problem. The enforcement activity is informed by all stakeholders, who share information and co-ordinate their response.

Business Engagement

CAP champions the use of Challenge 25 and PASS and also supports independent retailers/licensees with training including on conflict resolution, identifying fake ID and how to make a challenge. A CAP scheme will ensure that all messages and literature are co-ordinated across the CAP area, targeting specific groups where appropriate.

3.0 The Ollerton Community Alcohol Partnership

- 3.1 For a CAP to be successful there has to be commitment from local agencies that are striving to make a difference with young people. Ollerton has had periodic issues with underage drinking and when a planning meeting was held in the Town there was immediate commitment to try and establish a CAP in the area.
- 3.2 The process for setting up a CAP is generally involve bringing together a number of agencies alcohol working to reduce alcohol related harm to young people and associated anti-social behaviour as well as involving local alcohol retailers. A small project group has been led by the district council to engage the local agencies and gain their commitment to a CAP. This has gone well and the next steps to formally establish a CAP are underway.
- 3.3 The local group has representations from the police, the district council (officer level), local youth services, local education academy representatives and the County Council.

4.0 Proposals

- 4.1 There are clear links between the work of the CAP and that of the Licensing Committee. Therefore it feels appropriate that the Licensing Committee should be represented on the Ollerton CAPs projects group.
- 4.2 As the group is locally focused it may be beneficial to have a representative who is knowledgeable about the Ollerton Area.

5.0 RECOMMENDATION

Members are asked to note the progress in establishing local CAP and are asked to nominate a representative to sit on the Ollerton CAP Project Group.

TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICES RECEIVED AND ACKNOWLEDGED BETWEEN 1 APRIL AND 30 JUNE 2018

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To inform Members of changes to Temporary Event Notices and notices that have been received and acknowledged between 1 April and 30 June 2018 inclusive.

2.0 Background

2.1 The Licensing Act 2003 introduced a light touch system for ad hoc, permitted temporary activities. A Temporary Event Notice (TEN) is given by an individual (a premise user) and authorises the premises user to conduct one or more licensable activities at premises.

2.2 There are two types of TEN;

- A standard TEN, to be given no later than 10 working days before the event to which it relates
- A late TEN, can be given 9 and not later than 5 working days before the event. Late TENs are intended to be used by premise user who is required for reasons outside their control to for example, change the venue at short notice.

2.3 Only the Police and Environmental Health can make representation against the TEN. Once the Police and Environmental Health receive a TEN, they have 3 working days to make any objections to it on the grounds of any of the four licensing objectives: prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm. If no objections are received the event will go ahead as planned. If an objection is received for a standard TEN the Council will have to organise a hearing to consider the objection and may impose conditions or decide that the event cannot go ahead. If an objection is received against a late TEN, no hearing is held and the application is refused.
