



Armed Forces Covenant Action Plan Newark and Sherwood District Council November 2018 – November 2019

The Armed Forces Covenant works to ensure Armed Forces personnel, both current and past, and their families, receive equal treatment and equal access to facilities and services. It also seeks to encourage local communities to develop a relationship with the service community in their area.

The Armed Forces Covenant defines the general principles that should govern the relationship between the Nation, the Government and the Armed Forces community. The Armed Forces Covenant aims to ensure that those who serve or have served and their families are treated fairly and are not disadvantaged because of their Service. The Armed Forces Covenant also encourages local communities to develop a relationship with the service community in their area. This includes serving members of the Armed Forces, their families, and veterans.

Newark and Sherwood District Council signed the Community Covenant on July 16 2013. Newark and Sherwood District Council also signed a revised copy of the 'Armed Forces Covenant' on 6 November alongside all local authorities within Nottinghamshire to reaffirm Nottinghamshire's commitment to the Armed Forces Community as part of the World War One commemorations.

Every Local Authority adhering to the Covenant is committed to produce and publish an Action Plan to underpin the Covenant. This forms part of the 'Core infrastructure for Covenant Delivery' which includes naming an Armed Forces Champion and attending the relevant Civil and Military Partnership Board. This action plan sets out the overall direction of the Covenant and helps ensure that Newark and Sherwood keeps on track with its commitments.
